# 699/23 Public Participation

Judith Clark resident of Langrigg was in attendance and expressed an interest in joining the Parish Council.

An enquiry had been received via Cumberland Council concerning the ownership of a piece of land near the village hall in Blencogo. The enquirer had been using the land regularly to walk dogs and had concerns that it may be privately owned land as a resident had raised concerns regarding this use. Members confirmed that the land is not privately owned and can be used by anyone, there is no issue with people using the area to walk dogs provided that any dog mess is cleaned up.

A complaint had been received regarding the wording on a sign erected in Blencogo referring to the dog fouling issues in the village. Cllr Underwood confirmed that the householder had now taken the sign down.
